

Durham's great outdoors

From walking and cycling to nature watching and watersports, discover Durham's great outdoors.

Head to the Durham Dales to enjoy everything from a scenic stroll, stopping off at quaint country pubs along the way, to a challenging trek. A number of long-distance routes, including the Pennine Way, Northern Saints Trails and Coast to Coast, take you through stunning landscapes, while the highest public A-road in England provides a cycle challenge certain to take your breath away.

For spectacular sights, head to High Force, one of England's most spectacular waterfalls, enjoy an incredible night of stargazing under Durham's dark skies in the North Pennines Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, and by day spot wildlife from the water's edge at Derwent Waterside Park. Or if you prefer to explore on two wheels, Hamsterley Forest is home to some of the best off-road cycling tracks in the UK, and is a magnet for mountain bikers.

2023 has been designated as the Year of the Coast, making it the perfect time to explore Durham's designated stretch of heritage coastline, which is recognised internationally for its rare plants and wildlife. Follow the Coastal Footpath for dramatic cliff top views across the North Sea. And for a rush of adrenaline, head to Seaham Harbour where you can take to the water to paddle board, kayak or canoe under expert guidance.

Even in historic Durham City there's the chance to get back to nature, with riverside walks, Crook Hall Gardens and the Durham University Botanic Garden. And for family fun in the fresh air, head to Wharton Park, Hardwick Park or Chester-le-Street Riverside Park for perfect play areas and places to explore.





From award-winning attractions to iconic buildings, take a step back in time and discover Durham's fascinating past.

The dramatic Durham Cathedral and Castle UNESCO World Heritage Site forms one of the most stunning city skylines in Europe, looking down upon the charming university city below. Visit Durham Town Hall and Palace Green Library for fascinating exhibits which shine a light on Durham's past. Get a close—up view of treasures from across the globe at the Durham University Oriental Museum. And on the outskirts of the city explore the stunning architecture and glorious grounds of Ushaw: Historic House, Chapels & Gardens.

In the Durham Dales, discover Raby Castle with its stunning interiors, 200–acre deer park, walled gardens and outdoor adventure play. Experience the life and work of Victorian lead mining families at Killhope, and in the market town of Barnard Castle you will find the magnificent sight of The Bowes Museum, with its outstanding collections of art, fashion and design. 2023 is the 250th anniversary of the museum's iconic Silver Swan and celebrations will be taking place throughout the year.

In the Vale of Durham experience the sights, smells, sounds and tastes of times gone by at Beamish, The Living Museum of the North, which vividly brings the past to life. Uncover the county's role in the development of the railways at Locomotion, and at Binchester Roman Fort see what life was like for the Romans in Durham. In the market town of Bishop Auckland, delve into 1,000 years of history at The Auckland Project – explore the magnificent Auckland Castle, Mining Art Gallery, and Spanish Gallery – the UK's first gallery dedicated to the art, history and culture of Spain. And in Autumn 2023, England's first Faith Museum will open its doors, offering seven new gallery spaces contemplating the ideas, implications and impact of faith in Britain.

For a truly unique experience don't miss Kynren – An Epic Tale of England. The live action open–air extravaganza that takes audiences on a journey through 2,000 years of history, myth and legend.

Durham Cathedral









Explore Durham Cathedral, part of Durham's UNESCO World Heritage Site. Visit the resting places of iconic Northern Saints, St Cuthbert and the Venerable Bede, as pilgrims have done for 1,000 years, and discover the cathedral's history as a place of faith, art and remembrance.

Look up to see stained glass windows, pause by the County Durham miners and local regiment memorials and explore the iconic Cloisters. Step into the cathedral's museum to see the treasures of St Cuthbert on display in the spaces which were previously part of Durham's medieval Benedictine monastery, such as the Monks' Dormitory and the Great Kitchen.

No admission charge. If you are able, please consider donating £5 to support the cathedral's future.


In Spring, events will be taking place across the county to mark the Coronation of His Majesty the King in May.




